

Living on campus has its benefits. You'll save money, meet new people, and have lots of opportunities to get involved.


UNO offers six different apartment-style housing facilities on Dodge and Scott campuses. Each facility offers a fun, safe environment and a chance for you to practice independent living.



# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Along with your application, you'll be asked to submit test scores and an official high school transcript. No application fee required for domestic students. Your records must show completion of the 16 minimum course unit requirements (below) and one of the following:

- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 (4.0 scale)
- ACT composite score of 20+
- Class ranking in the upper 50%
- SAT score of 1040+

#### **COURSE UNIT REQUIREMENTS** | (16 total)

ENGLISH	All units must include intensive reading and writing experience.	4 units
MATH	Courses must include Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry	3 units
SOCIAL SCIENCE	At least one (1) American and/or World History; one (1) American Government and/or Geography	3 units
NATURAL Science	At least two (2) must be selected from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Earth Sciences. One (1) must include a lab course	3 units
ELECTIVE	One additional year from any listed above	1 unit
WORLD Language*	Students must complete 2 units (typically equivalent to two years) of the same world language during high school.	2 units

\*Students without a world language may still be admitted. Some colleges may require it later for degree completion, depending on the program.



# TRANSFER INFORMTAION

#### TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

Official coursework completed after high school graduation from a regionally-accredited or non-accredited collegiate institution\*

Graduated from a regionally-accredited high school or completed the equivalent academic training (GED)

Meet the GPA requirement for the program to which you applied

Be in good academic standing at your previous institution(s). Students transferring from a NU campus must complete the change of campus form

\* If you have 24 or more transferable credits, UNO does not need your HS transcript to make an admissions decision. Under 24 credit hours, we will require your transcript.

#### **PROGRAM GPA REQUIREMENT**

Each college has transfer/readmit student GPA requirements. You can be admitted to UNO with a 2.0 GPA. However, if you do not meet the program GPA, you will be put into an alternate program.

- College of Business Administration | 2.5 GPA
- College of Communication, Fine Arts and Media | 2.25 GPA
- College of Education, Health, and Human Sciences | 2.0 GPA
- College of Engineering | 2.5 GPA

- College of Public Affairs and Community Service | 2.5 GPA

We want to make sure that any Nebraskan who wants to get a college education can. And we don't want cost to get in the way of getting your degree. If you're a Nebraskan who feels that college is not within your reach right now, we're here to say: it is.

The Nebraska Promise program covers undergraduate tuition for students who meet academic qualifications and have a family income of \$65,000 or less (Adjusted Gross Income/AGI) or are Pell Grant-eligible.
